

LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

"Biblical Honey"

In summer, it is a joy to see bees feeding on the fruit of flower and forest. But, how do you take your honey? During the colder months, I stir it into my bowl of porridge or into my nighttime drink of Ovaltine (other beverages are available!). In the warmer months, I find I enjoy it on toast, or even stirred into a homemade muesli. My favourite kind of honey is Swiss Wald (forest) Honey when the bees have been feeding on forest insects such as aphids. It has a dark amber colour, it is runny, and it is delicious. Honey as a natural sweeter is said to be good for your health physical and mental.



In the book of Proverbs from the Old Testament, we find this:

My son, eat honey, for it is good, and the drippings of the honeycomb are sweet to your taste.

Know that wisdom is such to your soul;

if you find it, there will be a future, and your hope will not be cut off.

Biblical wisdom then, is also sweet to the taste of our soul or spirit, and it comes with many health benefits, spiritual, mental and even physical. It directs our lives into the path that is good for us. Biblical wisdom offers the blessings of a future and a hope eternal.

Charles Bridges, an Anglican clergyman from Old Newton in Suffolk during the first part of the 19th century, wrote in his commentary on Proverbs, of the blessings of this spiritual honey and the health it brings, in terms of a love that passes knowledge, a peace that passes all understanding and a joy that is inexpressible and glorious. However, he points out that to enjoy its blessing, we need to partake of it.

So, how do you take your spiritual honey? How do you become acquainted with God-given wisdom? I know no better way than to delve into the scriptures regularly – even daily and allow its sweetness to delight your soul. Or, the next time you put honey in a beverage or use it to sweeten your food, open a Bible at the same time and enjoy some spiritual honey. In so doing, you will be led to the one in whom are all the sweet treasures of wisdom – Jesus himself.

Believing the best.

Read: Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 1 Cor. 13: 4-7.

Ask yourself: Do you bring out the good in people or the bad? Do you help them to discover their potential or crush their confidence?

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, as you have seen the good in me, so help me to see the good in others, for your name's sake. Amen.

A God who never sleeps.

Read: I will look up towards the hills – from where will my help come? It comes from the Lord, maker of heaven and earth. He will not allow your foot to stumble, for he who keeps you will not slumber. The Lord will guard your going out and coming in, now and always. Psalm 121 (part).

Ask yourself: Have you lost sight of the fact that God is always keeping watch? Have you mistakenly imagined he has turned his back on you or is no longer interested in your welfare?

Pray: Gracious God, for the constancy of your love, the faithfulness of your guidance and the certainty of your help, receive my thanks and praise, in the name of Christ. Amen.

The Kingdom within.

Read: He said to them, 'when you pray, use words like these': "Our Father in heaven, to you be praise and honour. May your kingdom come and your will be done, here on earth as it is in heaven".' Matthew 6: 9-10.

Ask yourself: do you see the kingdom of God as something that will come in the distant future or as already having begun here on earth? What are you doing to help make that kingdom more real?

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, instead of looking for your kingdom, may I help to build it, through your grace. Amen.

Just as I am.

Read: While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." Matthew 9: 10-13.

Ask yourself: Do you still, deep down, feel that you must earn God's forgiveness?

Pray: Gracious God, you know what I have been, you know what I want to be, but above all you value what I am. May that truth teach me to value myself and others, and above all to value you and your great love in Christ. Amen.

World Earth Day Service at Hemblington



Weaving creation care throughout the liturgical year helps to ensure that the fifth mark of mission is embedded in the worshipping life of a congregation, as the Revd Sue Shillam of All Saints in Hemblington explains:

All Saints Church is a small round tower church which sits amongst the fields to the east of Norwich. We have always been close to nature, and we enjoy special relationships with the farmers who are our neighbours. Indeed, generations of farmers now rest in peace in our churchyard.

Our churchyard is a conservation area and acts also as a large garden where passersby rest and enjoy the views and the wildflowers. Our management and care of our outside spaces has contributed to first, our bronze Eco Church Award, and now our Silver Award.

Last year, we created a special service for Creation Sunday and then, of course, Harvest. This year, we decided to try and focus on World Earth Day, Creation Sunday, and Harvest. The challenge in writing these special services was that a lot of the material was similar. To try to solve this problem, we reached out to Barbara Bryant at the Diocese who provided some useful information together with some additional information from our Cathedral.

We didn't use the published theme for World Earth Day, instead we focused on the 'Wisdom of the Trees' and used material from the <u>Bible Reading Fellowship Green Reflections</u>. Other material which was useful for ideas came from the <u>Creation Care Prayers</u> Environmental Programme Church of England. It truly was a labour of love to put the services together and ensuring that a number of the congregation played a part in the service.

These services attract a number of people from the rural areas, and we anticipate more involvement from our local school who currently use our churchyard as part of their school studies.

We propose now, that this schedule of creation services will feature each year in our calendar of services.

Eco Church is provided free of charge, to help as many churches as possible celebrate what they're doing to care for the environment, and decide what to tackle next. It costs us money to keep it running, though.


