LETTER FROM OUR CHURCH WARDENS

As you know, Kevin, our Rector, retired at the end of September. Both he and Helene, were very appreciative of the cards, gifts and good wishes from everyone at his last Benefice Service on the 29th September. So, you may be thinking, "why isn't there a replacement for Kevin here now?" That is because, in the Church of England, there is always a planned gap before a new appointment. The old fashioned term is 'Interregnum' – which is the time between the departure of the current rector and the arrival of a new incumbent.

There are good reasons for this. It provides a period for full and honest reflection and an opportunity to recognise where change may be necessary in order to grow as a Benefice. It also gives the Diocese of Norwich the chance to consider if changes to the way parishes are organised might be beneficial. It is already the intention to join together the churches in the Blofield and Broadside Benefices into a new Benefice.

During an Interregnum, Churchwardens will share the overall responsibility for their churches, ensuring that worship, pastoral care and mission continue in the parish, and that all in positions of responsibility are properly supported.

The Churchwardens are supported by the Rural Dean, the Archdeacon, the Ministry team, the PCCs and volunteers. They will arrange for guest preachers to take the Sunday services, where gaps in the Ministry team rota exist (and any other events) and handle their expenses. The Churchwardens are usually responsible for announcing the final selection and arrival of a new incumbent to the parish, by reading aloud the Bishop's official letter of appointment during the Sunday service.

The process for appointing a new vicar is set out under the Patronage (Benefices) Measure 1986. As a first step, our PCCs are required to prepare a statement (or Benefice profile) describing the conditions, needs and traditions of the parishes. The Bishop may also provide a statement, describing the needs of the diocese and the wider interests of the church.

Once the PCCs have completed the parish profile, a meeting is typically held between the Bishop, the Patrons and the PCCs to approve it, as well as to agree the arrangements for advertising the position and the process for interviewing shortlisted candidates. However, we have a 'Suspension of Presentation', which means the Patrons will not exercise their right of presentation. Therefore, the Bishop, the Archdeacon, the Rural Dean, the Deanery Synod Lay Chair, and the PCCs representatives (usually the Churchwardens) make up the group that is involved in the interview and selection process.

This process inevitably, takes a while to complete – an interregnum can often last up to nine months. We are, however, working hard to complete the process as quickly as we can, and the Churchwardens of all the PCCs in the proposed new Benefice have already completed a first draft of the Profile which is currently out for consultation with the Bishop, Archdeacon and Rural Dean. We will keep you posted on progress!

Reflections for November 2024 The season starts to change

Under the carpet

Read: Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers over all offences. (Proverbs 10: 12)

An unwitting mistake

Read: You know my folly, O God; there can be no hiding my wrongs from you. (Psalm 69: 5)

Ask yourself: What inadvertent mistakes have you made recently? What caused them? What might have avoided them? Have you put them behind you?

Pray: Living God, flawed and fallible though I am, work within me by your grace to do your will and fulfil your purpose, through Christ my saviour. Amen.

Inner Peace

Read: Peace I leave with you: my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. (John 14: 27)

Ask yourself: Do you feel at peace with yourself? Is your life based on the things that really matter?

Pray: Loving God, wherever I am, wherever I go, whatever I do, however I feel, I know that you will be with me, to hold, to heal, to guide and to bless. So, I will go in peace, assured of your unfailing love. Amen.

The everlasting arms

Read: The eternal God is your dwelling place, and underneath are the everlasting arms. (Deuteronomy 33: 27)

Ask yourself: Do you feel vulnerable and alone? Are you scared of what the future might hold? Have you lost sight of the encircling arms of God?

Pray: Living God, embrace me in your arms, and circle me with your grace, and infold me in your love, for Jesus' sake. Amen.

WILDING (2023, 1h 15m, Documentary)

FATHER IGNATIUS

Joseph Leycester Lyne, born on the 23rd November 1837, became Father Ignatius later. He was considered to be rather eccentric and overly pious. He pushed for the introduction of monasticism in the Church of England. Despite being an Anglican, his preference for high church tradition saw him favour many Catholic practices and attempt to reintroduce them. He was fascinated with religious orders and founded the Society of the Love of Jesus.

While in Belgium, he took the opportunity to visit monasteries and convents, studying their rules and adopting a monastic habit. Upon his return to England, he refused to stop wearing his habit, which saw him resign. Now calling himself Father Ignatius, he attempted to establish a monastic community in Ipswich, but was forced to move and set up his monastery in Elm Hill, Norwich. He even tried to build an abbey in the city. He faced growing resistance and Elm Hill was dispersed due to a mistake in the title deeds.

He spent some time wandering the country before purchasing land, in 1868, near Capel-y-ffin in the Black Mountains, Wales, and built Llanthony Abbey, four miles further up the valley from Llanthony Priory. Being an unconventional and charismatic preacher, there were even stories of miracles and visions.

He died in 1908 and was buried in Llanthony Abbey. The abbey was left to the few remaining monks, subject to the right of an adopted son, William Leycester Lyne. In 1911, it passed into the hands of the Anglican Benedictine community of Caldey Island.

After his death, it is said that his ghost can be seen wandering through Elm Hill, Norwich, cursing those unfortunate enough to meet him!
